PROCUREMENT



Local Food Purchasing:

School Nutrition purchases local food for school nutrition programs *purchase from farms who identify as historically underutilized businesses; buy and promote culturally relevant foods

Local Food Recipes & Taste Tests:

Local food recipes are used in school nutrition programs and taste tests expose students to local foods. *share POC cultural history and current foodtraditions



Farmer & Food partners:

Students are connected to farmers and experience school visits from farmers or farm field trips *partner with farms who identify as historically underutilized businesses. exploring knowledge & history of POC agriculture



Healthy, Local **Food Environment:**

Schools engage in programs and promotions for healthy school and community environments *display images of current POC and women farmers and the rich cultural history of POC farmers



SUSTAINABLE ENGAGEMENT

Training:

Farm to school trainings offered, attended, and supported (such as Culinary Institute) *attend, support, offer trainings in Racial Equity to teachers and f2s partners focusing on bringing a racial equity lens to f2s work

EDUCATION



Classroom **Curriculum:**

Lessons offer Food Systems; Agriculture; Local Food Nutrition. Health, & Wellbeing Education

*teach the knowledge & history of POC food and ag



Hands-on Cooking:

Students are connected to hands-on cooking of local foods through safe food preparation (such as Jr. Chef competition) *explore POC cultural history and current food traditions and cooking practices



Hands-on Gardening:

Edible gardens located on school grounds or nearby are used by classes *explore different plants related to cultural growing, foodways, or practices



Community **Engagement:**

Schools and/or LEAs engage community partners in farm to school activities (such as work with Local Food Councils) *prioritize POC leadership and collective work in working with community members



Policy:

Farm to school is named explicitly in school and LEA-level written policies/practices *address racial equity at the school board level and develop school-centered resiliency strategies for emergency times





Visibility of equity principles related to farm to school, across criteria: racial equity addressed in policies, educational practices, and the whole school environment; *RE example possibilities in each category, such as attend, support, and offer trainings in Racial Equity for Nutrition and School staff or address Racial Equity issues at the school board level.
